Letter from the President—Sherm Carlson



On the 11th day of September, 1996, REA³D Articles of Incorporation were filed with the State of Minnesota, establishing REA³D as a non-profit entity. The small founding group for this effort included Coleen Maiers, Scott Moe, Jim Schwarzbauer, Kathy Bush, (who suggested the creative

acronym) Ted Peterson, and Jake Benson.

REA³D's mission to support lifelong learning was clarified in the Articles at the time, but strategies to move forward and make that vision a reality remained vague for the first few years. The foundation solicited the Duluth Superior Area Community Foundation (now known as the Boreal Waters Community Foundation) to become the umbrella organization for REA³D's compliance with non-profit legal obligations.

And so the quest began to search for creative means to build the endowment to \$100,000 which was required by the DSACF to begin awarding grants from the interest on the fund. The suggested approaches were wide and varied: Bay View penny drive, dinner hosted by the PHS

catering club, "REA³D power water" sales, a REA³D cookbook, staff payroll deductions, direct mail campaigns, community support, pop machine revenue, Ann Reed concert, and the list went on.

When the magic number was reached in 2007, REA³D made nine initial grant awards which totaled \$3,297 and averaged \$300-\$400 each. More requests quickly started to appear; the money available to award often falling short of what was being requested. REA³D supporters stepped up to help build REA³D's capacity with increasingly generous donations over the next two decades.

Fast forward 30 years to the printing of this fall/winter newsletter. The REA³D Board, at its annual meeting this summer, amended its bylaws to raise the maximum amount for fall and spring grant awards (average of 12 per year) from \$1,000 to \$2,500 each, along with allowing larger discretionary grants. Furthermore, up to an identified amount of 5 percent of the endowment will be set aside for distribution each year. This year that amount available to award is \$46,000. Who could've known that almost 30 years later, that early vision of our founders has become a resounding reality!

Memorialized Teacher Influences a Life Choice

When I was going to be a junior (11th grade) in 1966-1967 at PHS, I decided to take an elective home economics class instead of a study hall. The classroom teacher was Mrs. Mildred Bell, and she had a student teacher from UMD named Mrs. Phyllis Donley. (Memorialized in the picture below.) So, I had Mrs. Donley as a student teacher that year. I took home economics the next year as a senior (12th grade 1967-68) and what do you know!? Mrs. Donley had been hired as a full-time classroom teacher. I really liked Mrs. Donley—the way she taught and her personality. She was knowledgeable and friendly. As it turned out, Mrs. Donley encouraged me to go into education at UMD—maybe even home economics education! And, that's what I did. When I finished my B.S. degree in home economics and art education at UMD, Proctor Public

Schools happened to PROC JR ALUMNI need a home economics teacher and Mrs. Phyllis Donley recommended me—her former student—to the hiring team. The rest is a

The target participation for this effort was 30-35 kids, but the community response resulted in nearly 50 registrations. REA³D supported startup of this effort with a \$3,300 grant.
